J. KEY AND PUSH BUTTON TELEPHONE SERVICE

J.1 General

J.1.1 Key telephone systems are furnished by means of keys mounted in the base of the telephone instrument or in separate boxes located near the telephone instrument and provide one or more of the following service features:

J.1.1.1 Pick-Up: An arrangement whereby a telephone may be connected to one or more lines by key operation at that telephone.

J.1.1.2 Hold: An arrangement in which, by key operation, a call may be held on one line while a call is originated or answered on another line at that telephone.

J.1.1.3 Intercommunicating: An arrangement in which, by key operation, two or more persons may communicate with each other over an interior line without the use of central office switching equipment.

J.1.1.4 Signaling: An arrangement whereby signaling is provided between stations either automatically, by key operation, by dial operation or by push button. In addition, common signals are provided to indicate those lines being rung, in use or being held.

J.1.1.5 Cut-Off, Ringer Transfer and Exclusion: An arrangement in which a station user may disconnect bells, telephones or other equipment and transfer a ringer to a main station.

J.1.2 Key telephone systems and equipment are available only in connection with individual line, private branch exchange service and private line service.

J.1.3 All telephones associated with a key telephone system normally are located on the same premises. Stations will not be provided at excessive distances from associated power equipment or other main or extension stations, if in the judgment of the Telephone Company, such distances will prevent the furnishing of satisfactory service.

J.1.4 Keyless telephones may be bridged to any line of a key telephone system. The number of telephones which may be connected to a line either directly or by key operation is limited to such numbers as in the judgment of the Telephone Company will not interfere with efficient service.

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J.1 General (Cont'd)

J.1.5 Suitable commercial power, including outlets, which may be required for the operation of the power equipment associated with key telephone systems shall be furnished by the customer.

J.1.6 The monthly rates quoted are in addition to the monthly exchange rates applicable for the type of service furnished, including mileage charges, if any. See Section J.3 below for installation, move and change charges applicable to key telephone equipment.
